Communications/ social media	<ul> <li>Update since last meeting on Website, Twitter, FB</li> <li>Need to let membership know about these, and to disseminate</li> <li>Are there any issues to do with running these?</li> <li>Is Googledrive working ok</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Agreed these ground rules on communications:</li> <li>Emails within steering group (SG) – send these on a need to know basis, not blanket. Use tags in header- for action, for comment, for review, for info</li> <li>Emails to whole of SECA – there will be 2 types- 'newsletters' and 'calls for action'. Need to use bcc carefully and take care of data protection.</li> <li>Facebook – not everyone uses this, so it is definitely not for essential communications. But it does have a useful social media function for campaigns, discussion, stories etc. So provisionally agreed to open up FB group to make it a public page. Benefits probably outweigh the risks. We need people to post and moderate this: CLIVE and GEOFF will be interim moderators plus any other volunteers we can find. CARRIE- did you agree to be involved? ALL need to look for volunteers to help with Facebook. Timing of change to public to be discussed.</li> <li>Website – GEOFF is happy to be the main editor. Send suggestions for the website to him Geoff@barnards.plus.com</li> <li>2 suggestions for website: add the global map of declarations to the front page; have a button to take people direct to 'Write to Them' website GEOFF to consider</li> <li>Twitter – GEOFF, JAY, CLIVE and MICHELE will post. This will be important way of engaging with the public/businesses/organisations etc GEOFF to share logins</li> <li>Googledrive – any problems with logging in let Geoff know.</li> <li>Newsletter –CLIVE will prepare the next newsletter to SECA following this meeting and liaise with SALLY on what to put in it.</li> </ul>

3. Membership list and mailing list	<ul> <li>Update on new member groups.</li> <li>Would be good to have a list of member groups with key contacts, etc.</li> <li>How do we manage the individual and group mailing lists from now on? (Do we have a central list? Who can access it? Mailchimp or Gmail?)</li> <li>Are political parties allowed to be member groups?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>New groups: Keep Wisborough Green, CPRE Sussex, Greening Westbourne, Sustainability Centre (East Meon), Green Spirit Horsham. There is now a list of affiliated organisations on Googledrive – contact Sally with any new groups. She will add to the googledrive, and let Geoff know to put on the website. We need the name of the group, URL, FB, Twitter, and phone/email of one key contact. GEOFF to create a contacts group on the SECA Gmail account so we can easily send emails to SG members, or SECA member groups.</li> <li>Ideas for new groups to approach: TONY Sussex and Surrey Wildlife Trusts; NICOLA FOE, Greenpeace local groups, Weald Action Group; CLIVE WI ?, Everyone to think of other groups to approach and go ahead and contact them. Schools are also a possibility, with heads agreement.</li> <li>Wording: change our description from an 'umbrella group for environmental groups', to an 'umbrella group for environmental and community groups and concerned individuals ' or similar- GEOFF to decide and alter on website.</li> <li>Individuals: – Carrie, Catherine and Viv are managing the main mailing list. We will transfer it to mailchimp and ensure data protection messages etc are included on website CARRIE and GEOFF to liaise</li> <li>Political parties: there was discussion over this. We agreed that we will not allow political parties to affiliate to SECA, but of course any individual is welcome to join.</li> </ul>
4. Feedback on councils	<ul> <li>See progress summary on Googledrive</li> <li>Any contacts with other councils?</li> <li>Any other important contacts made?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Checklist: There is a checklist of progress toward declaring a climate emergency (DCE) for all County and District Councils in Surrey and Sussex on SECA googledrive (in Specific Councils folder). There is a summary of this on the website on the campaigns page. We ran through this. The biggest news is that Jonathon is putting forward a DCE motion to Surrey County Council on 20<sup>th</sup> March.</li> <li>SALLY and GEOFF to update this checklist and website.</li> </ul>
5. Discussion about strategy following Jonathan Essex call	<ul> <li>See summary of Zoom call attached to the agenda email for this meeting</li> </ul>	We went through the key points from the call with Jonathan. Agreed to carry on with plans to campaign for DCE at both county and district level. Jonathan suggested creating a sub-group of individuals interested in discussing details of what makes an effective CE motion, and how best to galvanise followup. JONATHAN to lead with MICHELE, TONY, ALISON, JAY, GEOFF

6. County councils next steps?	<ul> <li>Which county councils are we targeting?</li> </ul>	<b>NB THIS IS OUR CAMPAIGN PRIORITY FOR THIS MONTH, MARCH 2019</b> We are targeting Surrey and West Sussex County Councils for now.
	<ul> <li>Working with councils - who does what?</li> </ul>	<b>SURREY CC</b> DCE (declaration of climate emergency) motion due on 20 <sup>th</sup> March 2019. To be proposed by Jonathan Essex (Green Party).
	<ul> <li>How do we mobilise the member groups to take action – what do we want them to do (e.g. Letter writing campaign)?</li> </ul>	There is not much time, but Carrie will contact Dorking (Pat Smith and Belle Hard) to ask them to reach out to other environmental and community groups in Surrey and try to get a letter writing campaign to county councillors off the ground, asking them to support the DCE motion. CARRIE, BELLE, PAT NB Wait until this Friday 8 <sup>th</sup> March to start writing letters as the motion will not go public until then.
	• Demo 5 <sup>th</sup> April WSCC – who	WEST SUSSEX CC DCE motion due on 5 <sup>th</sup> April, proposed by Michael Jones (Labour).
	can organise?	<ul> <li>Amendments: the motion is reasonable, but could be made stronger by amendments (eg by linking to the budget, planning training for councillors, making wording stronger) We have councillor contacts who may help with this, but we need to be careful about not alienating Michael Jones or any of the parties. Jay and Jonathan pointed out that the DCE is the first step for the council and indicates a wide commitment. It can then be built on afterwards in layers- we don't need to try to get everything in at once. Discussion on tactics, then we agreed that SALLY, JAY and TONY will get together/phone this week to look at amendments to improve the motion, and how to best to influence things.</li> <li>Letter writing campaign: GEOFF will pull together a 'call to action' email to send out to SECA member groups, and to the mailing list to mobilise them to write to their councillors to support the DCE motion and get friends and contacts to do likewise. ALL to follow through and mobilise our own groups.</li> <li>Demonstration: We agreed it would be good to mount another demo on Friday April 5<sup>th</sup>, the day of the council meeting at Chichester, to drive the message home. MICHELE will organize with Worthing CAN and disseminate info via Facebook (event page already set up) ALL to get there if we can and mobilise as many others as possible</li> </ul>
		<b>EAST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL</b> We are not aware of any DCE motions being proposed at ESCC. JAY will do some exploring to see whether he can find out any more.

7. District councils/ local elections next steps?	<ul> <li>Do we stick with plan to put pressure on district councils via upcoming election – if so how?</li> <li>Approaching political parties</li> <li>Local campaigns/Posters/pledges</li> <li>How do we mobilise the member groups to take action?</li> </ul>	NB THIS WILL BE OUR CAMPAIGN PRIORITY FOR APRIL 2019 Agreed that we stick to the plan of campaigning at district level as well as county, and to use local elections for our focus. Polling day is May 2 <sup>nd</sup> . Contacting political parties re campaign literature: Steyning 10:10 has started contacting all 4 main parties saying SECA will be campaigning and suggesting they may like to include their support for DCE in their campaign literature, and have photos of candidates with our SECA pledge card See SECA website https://seclimatealliance.uk/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/Pledge-card.pdf Boosts to this initial contact will be helpful. We need to try to get awareness to the whole party machine over the region if possible. JAY will contact Morwen Millson Lib Dems NICOLA/CARRIE will talk to Jeremy Quinn Conservative ALISON will talk to Labour contacts. (Caroline Fife in Steyning is on board) CATHERINE will contact Greens Local election letter writing to candidates and pledge campaign April 2019 We can discuss this at our next SECA steering meeting and will need to mobilise quickly again then. But best to leave this for now so as not to confuse people.
8. Media strategy	How do we make a splash with local/national press/radio/TV?	Agreed it would be best to divide up efforts and take advantage of our respective media contacts: Sarah Sharp has good contacts in Chichester Nicola and Carrie have press contacts in Mid Sussex Michele has contacts in Worthing NICOLA to come up with a suggested timeline for potential stories (e.g. County campaigns in Surrey and W Sussex, Demo in Chichester, District campaigns in local elections) Its probably best to have a small SECA media group to discuss SECA press releases before they go out – suggest this is Nicola, Carrie, Michele, Geoff
